INDEPENDENCE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

Meeting held at the Municipal Building, Great Meadows, NJ. February 9, 2016 7:00 p.m.

This is a regular meeting of the Township Committee of Independence Township, Warren County, New Jersey. This meeting was called to order by Mayor Robert Giordano at 7:02 p.m. with the following announcement: "Adequate notice of this meeting was given in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act by providing a schedule of regular meetings to the Star Gazette and The Express Times, posting a copy thereof on the Township bulletin board and filing a copy thereof in the office of the Municipal Clerk." The Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag was led by Mayor Giordano.

<u>Tax Collector</u> - Posted

<u>Construction/Zoning</u> – Reports were submitted.

<u>Environmental</u> – Mayor Giordano noted that the Township may be eligible for some relief from FEMA because of the last storm.

Treasurer – Budget meeting this Saturday.

Recreation/Green Acres – John Cummins submitted the Minutes from the last meeting. They have excess baseball equipment (both new and used) that they can sell if the Committee will give them authorization to do so. Sign-ups for softball have started. Booster participation has been discussed.

Discussion ensued concerning the excess sports equipment. Mr. Cougle made a motion for the donation/sale of the recreational items that are unneeded pending the attorney's notification on the proper procedure. Mr. Feula seconded the motion with roll call as follows:

Mr. Cougle noted that he found a deer killed in the woods after hunting season had ended. He notified the authorities and asked that our police department be aware of this also.

Emergency Services – Keith Aiello discussed the progress with the generators.

DPW – Report was submitted. New parts have been installed on the truck. Mayor Giordano noted that discussion has ensued on employment and it appears that it would be beneficial to hire a full time person for the six (6) to nine (9) months to mow the grass at the Field of Dreams. The title and amount will be discussed at the next budget meeting. Municipal Clerk: It has been busy in the office and there seems to be problems with the mail.

<u>Land Use Board</u> – Mr. Feula stated that the Board was in session until 11:30 pm last night discussing a conceptual application and a presentation on legal issues.

NEW BUSINESS: Introduce/First Reading of Ordinance 2016-01: Ordinance to Exceed the Municipal Budget Appropriation Limits and to Establish a Cap Bank (NJSA 40A:4-45.14.)

Ordinance 2016-01

CALENDAR YEAR 2016 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A., 40A:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Township of Independence in the County of Warren finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2016 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that a 3.5 percent increase in the budget

for said year, amounting to \$98,732.16 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise Permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Governing Body of the Township of Independence, County of Warren, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2016 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Independence shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:40-45.14, be increased by 3.5% amounting to \$98,732.16, and that the CY 2016 municipal budget for the Township of Independence be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

Discussion ensued and it was noted that this has been done every year. Ms. Hrebenak will ask Bill Schroeder, Township Auditor, to explain this further in writing. A motion was made to introduce Ordinance 2016-1 by Mr. Cougle. Mr. Feula seconded the motion with roll call as follows:
